You need to know!!

WHY DO YOU ABSOLUTELY NEED TO NOMINATE HIM THIS YEAR?

- Mr. Guterres' second mandate as Secretary-General is coming to an end in January 2025. Therefore, he is completing his life-long career as a devoted servant to the world and humanity at the United Nations.
- The Nobel Peace Prize rewards the achievements of one person for the CURRENT year, so, it is now or never that we get to honor our incredible leader and peace maker.

WHO CAN NOMINATE MR. GUTERRES?

Qualified nominators: A nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize is only considered valid if submitted by a person who meets certain criteria. According to the statutes of the Nobel Foundation, a nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize is considered valid if it is submitted by a person who falls within one of the following categories, a personal application for an award will not be considered:

1. Members of national assemblies and national governments (cabinet members/ ministers) of sovereign states as well as current heads of state
2. Members of The International Court of Justice in The Hague and The Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague
3. Members of l'Institut de Droit International
4. Members of the International Board of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom
5. University professors, professors emeriti and associate professors of history, social sciences, law, philosophy, theology, and religion; university rectors and university directors (or their equivalents); directors of peace research institutes and foreign policy institutes
6. Persons who have been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize
7. Members of the main board of directors or its equivalent of organizations that have been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize
8. Current and former members of the Norwegian Nobel Committee (proposals by current members of the Committee to be submitted no later than at the first meeting of the Committee after 1 February)
9. Former advisers to the Norwegian Nobel Committee

Unless otherwise stated the term 'members' shall be understood as current (sitting) members. If you belong to a group of qualified nominators, you may use the online nomination form to submit your nomination.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE NOMINATION
Secretary-General of the United Nations

Since the Nobel Peace Prize rewards not only lifetime achievements, but the peace building action led in the previous year, here is what the Secretary-General of the United Nations has been dedicated to in 2024:

Environment and Community:

- **In December 2023:** He decorated 14 leaders with the United Nations Human Rights Prize to reward them for their “extraordinary work, humanity and courage”, while reminding the world of essential literacy and legal frameworks such as The Universal Declaration of Human Rights or the UN Charter. *“I am personally shocked by the systematic undermining of principles and standards we used to take for granted”*.
- He is the only person I have ever heard standing at the General Assembly to denounce the scandal and threat of nuclear weapons. We have established a nuclear removal plan involving worldwide embassies and engineering trainings to facilitate the energy transition and redirect the focus from wars to the Space Olympics 2030.

Humanitarian relief in war zones:

- He sent **large-scale humanitarian relief operations to Gaza** during the war in Israel, while calling for a two-state solution: The United Nations sent between **100 and 500 trucks per day to support Israel with food and medicine** since the beginning of the conflict. UNRWA and UNHCR relocated victims of the war in hospitals, schools and shelters. Repeatedly suffered the loss of United Nations activists and service members. He went himself to the border when trucks were blocked in Egypt and could not deliver aid, sending international calls for new morals and cooperation. *“We need rapid, safe, unhindered, expanded and sustained humanitarian access into and across Gaza”*.
- He **condemned the large-scale missile attack in central Europe** and reminded the world of International laws. *“Even wars have rules”*, stated the United Nations. *“Civilians and children are not a target!”*. He visited children in hospitals in Rafah. He gathered the Security Council to propose conflict resolutions in Gaza. We adopted peaceful, non-invasive strategies to help them resolve their conflict without sending our troops, even though this might

have to change soon. He visited Palestine and Sudanese refugees in Egypt and Jordan to express solidarity and remind those who need it the most that they are not forgotten. *“We will never, ever give up on making this world better for everyone, everywhere”*.

- **In Ukraine**, the United Nations and their partners reached **11 million people with humanitarian assistance** by the end of 2023 and beginning of 2024.

Education, culture and peace-building:

- The United Nations' **General Assembly approved a \$3.58 billion budget** for 2024, including a special account to finance the Organization's Peace Building funds.
- **He promoted the power of role models and published portraits of leaders who changed the world** such as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr, Nelson Mandela, Kofi Annan or Major Radhika Sen of India (United Nations Military Gender Advocate of the Year) reminding each one of us that we all matter and that one person can make a difference.
- He **healed online tensions** by preaching for unity. *“Humanity is strongest when we stand together”*. He guided us all along this year, giving us hope and keeping us accountable. He has spread a message of unity on all his communication platforms daily, which were echoed by his teams to guide us into peace and wisdom.
- Him and the communication team **conducted interviews and created mini documentaries** all year long to educate and raise awareness about the tragedies happening in the world and offer solutions from different disciplines and view points.
- **He met survivors of the Holocaust and spoke against racism.** He visited temples of faith around the world to symbolize and educate on the power of unity; such as the Ohel-Jakob Synagogue in Munich. He met with the families of victims of the war in Gaza to offer his condolences and support.
- He spoke for the **right to education for girls in Afghanistan**, putting his life at risk several times in territories where journalists and activists are regularly killed.

- Amongst all this, he never gave up. He **travelled to witness and report** the melting glaciers in Nepal, the Antarctic ice loss, torrential rains and flash floods in Tonga, or raising sea level in Samoa, **spreading awareness and organizing Summits and conferences about Climate Action**. In every country, we have taken measures to limit the pace of global warming by starting the energy transition, creating electric cars stations and replacing lead pipes and avoid sanitary and health damages.
- Additionally to solving problems, **the United Nations have been leaders for prevention and information, organizing capacity-building workshops all around the world** in partnerships with corporations such as BMW, and events such as the Summit Of The Future, the Global Summit for Artificial Intelligence, or the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development. These are regular incentives to gather activists and establish world-changing strategies, guide on the next step to take at local and global scales.
- The United Nations offered **thousands of amazing employment opportunities**, encouraging young leaders to take on senior management positions and achieving gender equality in his Organization.

As Secretary-General of the United Nations, he has been coordinating and **leading all the branches of the United Nations, comprising 37,000 employees** among its worldwide branches, between the General assembly, Security Council, UNESCO, and all the other branches. The Office for Refugees, where he has served as a High Commissioner for ten years, is one of them and has also been awarded with the **Nobel Peace Prize**. He's earned it!
